<b>T.O.L.</b>	38/478, 8 April 1838, 4/4118 reel 892 for Maitland district, tried Somerset Assizes TOL passport PP 41/0279 23 June 1841, 4/4242 [reel 968] (as James <b>Brown</b> but TOL number associated with the passport is James Broom's). Allowed to proceed to Darling Downs in the service of Mr John Eales for 12 months (rec of Maitland Bench). TOL passport PP42/0704, 8 July 1842, 4/4246 [reel 970] (as James <b>Brown</b> but TOL number associated with the passport is James Broom's). Allowed to proceed to Darling Downs in the service of Mr Jno Eales for 12 months. TOL 46/1414, 17 October 1846, 4/4210 reel 960 for Moreton Bay district, tried Somerset Assizes. Notation: cancelled on 28 July 1851 absent from district. Conditional Pardon withheld until shall have regained and held a T Leave for six months. Ticket restored, absence explained, letter 55/309.
<b>C.P.</b>	55/39, 9 August 1855 as per notation on indent and second ticket-of-leave
