Allowed to proceed to Darling Downs in the service of Mr John Eales. Rec Maitland Bench. TOLPPT 43/1055, 24 November 1843, 4/4252 (reel 972). Allowed to remain at Liverpool Plains in the service of Mr John Eales for 12 months. Rec Mait Bench.
